





Is a fundraiser for dolphins by ceramic artist Todd Geiman. Since the s of the hunting season in Taiji Japan, which began on September 1st, 2013 a tx of 1,450 dolphins from six species have been driven into the cove. Of this to 834 were slaughtered, 158 were live-capture and 457 were released. These include bottlenose, Pantropical spotted, Risso's, Pacific white-sided, shor finned pilot whales, and striped dolphins.

I have created a series of unique, wheel thrown, reduction fired bottles to represent the dolphins taken by the cove. Through the sale of my bottles it i effort to raise awareness and generate funds to help end the Taiji dolphin slaughter.

30% of the artist's proceeds of each sale will go to the Sea Shepherd Conservat Society.

The show will be held at the Washington County Arts Council from March 28, 2014 through April 29, 2014 with an opening reception on Friday, Marc 2014 from 5-7 pm.


