War of 1812 Cavalry Jacket

Please join us and invited dignitaries at a reception for the unveiling and welcome home of our treasured War of 1812 relic, the cavalry jacket of Sgt. Jacob Huyett, in time for its 200th anniversary at the Battle of North Point in 1814, on Friday, September 5, 2014, at the Miller House Museum, 135 West Washington Street, Hagerstown, MD, from 5 to 7 p.m.

Those invited include Governor Martin O'Malley and Lt. Governor Anthony Brown, officials from the Maryland War of 1812 Bicentennial Commission, descendants of the owner of jacket and local county and city officials. A presentation on the history of the jacket and its owner will be made by John Gladhill, one of the descendants.

There will also be a small exhibit of other Washington County artifacts related to the War of 1812.


We thank the funders and WCHS member Douglas Bast for his efforts to preserve the relic for a number of years, in spite of its severely tattered condition.




