### 2015 HISTORIC HOUSES OF WORSHIP TOUR

SAINT MARKS LUTHERAN CHURCH
601 Washington Averuse
Founded in 1889 in the Western
Furtherise File House on Washington
Square, the church later moved onto
the square with the first church buding
which was replaced with the present
1920 Gothic Revival sanchusy. Features
include a three manual Moller organ,
depiction of Orlat according on the
atlar wall, German paint decordinons and
pristine wood work. Organ and piano
Christmas music throughout the tour.



### WASHINGTON SQUARE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

538 Washington Avenue
Washington Square was a mission churc
Paul's Methodist Episcopal Church – the Paul's Methodist Episcopal Church – the people met in an orchard beginning in 1885. A small chapel was built in 1886. In 1888 the land was purchased and a wood-frame church was built. The church building was dedicated in 1889.

### ST. JOHN'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH

Neo-gothic in style, St. John's was built in 1872. Natable features include a high Gothic after, the reredoc, a wrought iron od screen resperating the sancturary from the congregation and beautiful stained glass windows, one of which is a Tiffany. Vocal, piano and organ holiday music will be provided. Church houses a 60 rank Moeller organ.

# ZION REFORMED UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST

201 N. Potomac Street The Church first gathered in 1766, and in 1770. During the Civil War, the bell tower was used as a



tower was used as a simple post by Gen. Custer. The cemetery bears the remains of vertexns from the Revolutionary Mrs. French and Indian Mar, War of 1812, and our city's founder, Jonathan Hager. It has beautiful Tiffarry stained glass windows throughout. It is the dident church building in Washington Courty, Moller Organ music and refreshments.

TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH
N. Potomac Street & Randolph Avenue
Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church,
organized in 1859, is a hisboirc setting
with a wide variety of Immistries including

The connerstone was laid in 1999, making the begining of her ministy to the people of Haperstown, dedicated to sharing mission and ministry with all God's children in the name of Jesus Christ.



JOHN WESLEY UNITED METHODIST CHURCH
129 N. Potomac Street
Construction of this historic sandrusy, seating 540, was completed in 1865 at a cost of around \$50,000. Note the basufful stained and partied glass side windows and the large Ricce Window to the rear. A three manual, 51 rain Kilder per organ is located behind the pupit. If you look through the scene behind the ross you can see some of its 2,512 pipes.



BRIDGE OF LIFE CHURCH
14 S. Potomac Street
Bridge of Life is housed in a 1914-15
structure that was originally the Colonial
Theater. The facade is representable of
the Baroque style of theater architecture
popular in the early twenfelch century.
Bridge of Life has extensively remodeled
