





This theme represents the history of transportation in Washington County. "Our Journey Transports Us Through Time" depicts four predominate transportation related modes including a C&O Canal boat with mule team, a Fairchild C-119 Flying Box Car, a nickel plate locomotive #759, and a circa 1970 Mack RL700 truck.
