

HAGERSTOWN a de arts & entertainment district

Maryland is one of the first states in the country to develop Arts and Entertainment Districts on a statewide basis as a way to stimulate the economy and improve quality of life. Hagerstown's Arts and Entertainment District was one of the first designated in the State of Maryland. Incentives offered through the Arts and Entertainment District include:

- **Real Property Tax Credit**. The City and County will provide a 50% property tax credit for 10 years on the increase in assessment which results from a renovation project to create artist housing or space for Arts and Entertainment enterprises.
- Admissions & Amusement Tax Exemption Program. Enterprises dedicated to visual
 or performing arts located within the Arts and Entertainment District are exempt from the
 collection of the State of Maryland's Admissions and Amusement Tax.
- Income Tax Subtraction Modification Program. Qualifying artists who own or rent residential real property in the county where the Arts and Entertainment District is located and who conduct business in the District, may be eligible for a Maryland personal income tax subtraction modification to eliminate state and local income tax on their income from the sale, publication or production within the District of their artistic work that is written, composed or executed within the District.

takes place in an designated Arts & Entertainment District.

To take advantage of this benefit, just complete Maryland tax forms 502 and 502AE when you submit your tax return.

GRANTS REVIEW PANELIST NOMINATIONS

Each year, the Maryland State Arts Council (MSAC) relies on a diverse array of arts professionals to assist with the important work of evaluating grant applications. These qualified experts have experience in the field and an understanding of artistic and organizational standards in their artistic categories.

Panelists appointed by the MSAC, review grant applications, conduct on-site interviews and evaluations, submit written reports regarding assigned organizations and present their findings during a spring Grants

Review Panel meeting.

Panelists are appointed for one-year terms (which may be renewed), and receive a modest honorarium for service. Panelists are also reimbursed for travel expenses.

The Maryland State Arts Council and the University of Maryland, Baltimore (UMB) are now accepting applications for the **Health Sciences Facility III** public art project. Artists residing in the United States are eligible to apply. The artwork will be a three-dimensional sculpture sited on the exterior public plaza of the Health Sciences Facility III on the downtown UMB campus, located adjacent to the schools of Medicine, Dentistry and Pharmacy. Project completion date: September 2017. Up to four semi-finalist artists or artist teams will be selected for proposal development and receive a \$2000 honorarium. One artist or artist team will be selected. **Total project budget:** \$400,000.

MSAC 2016 Maryland Performing Artist Touring Artist Roster Guidelines and Application Now Available

Maryland Performing Artist Touring Roster guidelines and application are now available. One of the two components of the Maryland Presenting and Touring Program, the Roster is designed to promote the artistic collaboration between Maryland artists and Maryland presenters therefore further enhancing the cultural landscape of the State.



The Maryland Performing Artist Touring Roster is a juried group of Maryland artists who have a demonstrated history of professional touring engagements on a consistent basis. Artists on the Roster are selected through a peer review process in which they are rated on artistic merit and recommendations from presenting organizations where they have previously performed, among other criteria. The application and guidelines can be found on the MSAC website, https://www.msac.org/touring-artists-roster.

New applicants who want to be added to the Roster must submit the full application by September 16, 2016 at 5pm. Current Roster artists whose name begins with the letters A - G must also submit the full application by September 16, 2016 at 5pm.

All other current Roster artists whose name begins with the letters H - Z must submit the renewal application by September 2, 2016 at 5pm.

The second component of the program is the Maryland Touring Grant, a grant program designed for Maryland presenters who may apply for funding to help subsidize costs associated with engaging Roster artists for performances at their venues. For FY17, over \$70,000 was awarded in Maryland Touring Grants to 31 presenters in 18 counties across Maryland. The application and guidelines for this grant program will be made available in early 2017.
